

#### DID YOU KNOW?

Norway has 8 sites on UNESCO's World Heritage List. Four of them can be seen with Hurtigruten; Bryggen in Bergen, the Vega Islands, the Geirangerfjord (16 Apr - 15 Sep) and the Meridian Column in Hammerfest. With Hurtigruten you can explore these remote communities, from the temperate waters of the south to the cooler seas above the Arctic Circle. The residents of our ports of call often visit our ships. As our guest, they will also consider you theirs, welcoming you ashore to take a closer look.


The Hurtigruten vessels have called at many of these ports since 1893 so their arrival is still expected to be on schedule every day, all year round. Many of our ports of call along the way are little more than tranquil hamlets on tiny islands. The inhabitants rely on the Hurtigruten ships to bring essential groceries and supplies or to take them to the nearest town for shopping.

Other ports of call are long-established, bustling towns, owing their prosperity to the fishing, mining or shipbuilding industries. At each port you can expect something different. Explore the smaller ones on foot, by bike (available for hire from the ship) or stay on board and watch as goods and passengers leave and join.

At larger ports or during longer stays, you may wish to join one of the many excursions we offer, ensuring you get to experience the life, culture and landscape of this spectacular coastline.



The route expanded southward and included Bergen with three weekly departures.

The first ship to feature running water in all cabins was added to the Hurtigruten fleet.

Daily departures with Hurtigruten's fleet of 14 ships began from Bergen.

1930

Several ships were put into transport services for the Norwegian government during World War II. 9 out of 15 vessels in the Hurtigruten fleet were lost.

#### 1952

1940

Seven new ships were added in 3 years. The entire rebuilt Hurtigruten fleet featured modern diesel engines.
Hurtigruten carried 500,000 passengers annually.



The coastline between Bergen and Kirkenes is over 2,400km long, and in the 19th Century almost all of it was home to rich fishing grounds. The maritime maps were unreliable and there were only a few lighthouses, especially in the north. This important seaway was lined with perilous reefs, small islands and narrow inlets, and it was essential that a safe trade route be established to link the southern and northern regions of Norway.

When the Norwegian government decided to create a connection between the north and the south, Richard With and his friend Anders Holthe took on the challenge of thoroughly mapping the seas along the coastline. In 1893, Captain Richard With's steamer, DS Vesteraalen, was brought into regular service along the coast of Norway, and Hurtigruten was established. The service offered several weekly departures, first from Trondheim to Hammerfest and later from Bergen to Kirkenes in only seven days. He called this important connection 'Hurtigruten' (the fast route).

120 years later, we still carry freight and passengers. Our captains use their extensive maritime expertise to ensure that guests and goods are safely carried from port to port. Today, as then, the Hurtigruten ships are a part of Norwegian coastal life. One of the fleet's 11 ships departs Bergen daily, sailing to Kirkenes and back in 12 days at an average speed of 15 knots.

When will we welcome you on board Hurtigruten?

#### 1969

Hurtigruten set up an express route to Spitsbergen in the summer months.

#### 2001

On May 30, the Norwegian government listed the MS Lofoten as a national historical monument.

## 2002

Two new ships, MS Trollfjord and MS Finnmarken, were launched. Hurtigruten spent its first season in Antarctica.

#### 2006

2004

The MS Nordstjernen turns 50. The OVDS and TFDS Hurtigruten shipping companies merged to form Hurtigruten ASA.

#### 2011

The northbound voyage by MS Nordnorge from Bergen to Kirkenes was broadcast from 16 to 22 June 2011 and lasted 134 hr, 42 min and 45 sec. This is the longest non-stop live television documentary and a Guinness World Record!

The new MS Vesterålen, MS Midnatsol and MS Narvik replaced older vessels in the fleet.





DID YOU KNOW?

The Midnight Sun is a natural phenomenon, occurring in summer months above the Arctic Circle, where the sun remains visible above the horizon 24 hours a day.





After a long winter, warmth returns to the shores of Norway and sunlight rejuvenates life along the coastline. The sun works overtime to thaw this frozen land, rising higher and higher each day. Join us in experiencing three seasons in five days, and "The Arctic Awakening" of the Norwegian coastline.

Every new day brings a marked increase in both daylight hours and the greenery of the fjords. Bare branches shoot, and colour gently returns to the landscape. At the higher latitudes of the Arctic region, winter struggles to maintain its grip. Eventually, it relents although snow-caps still decorate the mountain tops of the north until the early summer. This is a time of celebration and May witnesses the festivities of Norwegian National Day (17 May), when the coastal communities become a blaze of colour and tradition. All our ships take part in the parades and celebrations.

#### THE ARCTIC AWAKENING

Hurtigruten's new spring concept, The Arctic Awakening, enriches the voyage with activities on board and exciting

new shore excursions. We take you closer to the teeming life in the ocean, the migratory birds and the local inhabitants of small communities. These are the ingredients of a Hurtigruten spring voyage. The return of the Arctic summer is like an infusion of vitamins kick-starting the birds, plants and animals in their breeding, growing and feeding. 


DID YOU KNOW?

#### DAY 1 Embarkation in Bergen

Ports visited today: Bergen
Take time to explore Bergen before we
depart. In the evening, your Hurtigruten
voyage sets sail through the Hjeltefjord,
following in the wake of the Vikings who
ventured from here to the Shetland Islands
and beyond.

#### DAY 2 Ålesund and Geirangerfjord

Ports visited today: Florø, Måløy, Torvik, Ålesund, Molde.

Enjoy the nature of the coastline as you sail towards Ålesund. From mid-April, your next destination will be the spectacular UNESCOlisted Geirangerfjord, where you will pass sheer, 800m cliffs and impressive waterfalls. 2A Geiranger Panorama

#### DAY 3 The Royal City of Trondheim

Ports visited today: Kristiansund, Trondheim, Rørvik.

In Trondheim, be sure to enjoy the views

from the Gamle Bybrua ("Old Town Bridge"), which dates back to 1861. Nidaros Cathedral, built between 1070 and 1300, is Norway's largest Gothic edifice. In the afternoon you set a northwest course, passing the beautiful Kjeungskjær lighthouse and numerous charming islets and rocky outcrops.

#### **DAY 4 Arctic Circle and Lofoten Islands**

Ports visited today: Brønnøysund, Sandnessjøen, Nesna, Ørnes, Bodø, Stamsund, Svolvær.

This morning you cross the Arctic Circle and by evening you reach the Lofoten Islands. This archipelago is renowned for its many quaint, picturesque fishing villages surrounded by majestic mountains.

#### DAY 5 Tromsø, the gateway to the Arctic

Ports visited today: Stokmarknes, Sortland, Risøyhamn, Harstad, Finnsnes, Tromsø, Skjervøy. After a stop in Harstad you continue via
Finnsnes to Tromsø for a longer stay. Many
of the epic Arctic expeditions used Tromsø
as a starting point. Why not join us on an
optional miniature kayak expedition!

#### DAY 6 Honningsvåg and the North Cape

Ports visited today: Øksfjord, Hammerfest, Havøysund, Honningsvåg, Kjøllefjord, Mehamn, Berlevåg.

Our day starts by sailing through Magerøysund before an early stop in Hammerfest. After a brief stop in Havøysund you arrive in Honningsvåg, the gateway the spectacular North Cape. Visiting the North Cape Plateau on an optional excursion, you get an eerie sense of being at the end of the world. As well as being continental Europe's northernmost point this area is also known for its birdlife, and springtime is when the birds return. Before Kjøllefjord a local fisherman will demonstrate traditional fishing techniques out on deck.

#### DAY 7 Kirkenes, the voyage turning point Ports visited today: Båtsfjord, Vardø, Vadsø,

The last port of the northbound voyage is Kirkenes. At longitude 30°E, you are actually further east than Istanbul and St. Petersburg. In spring you may still be able to participate in our winter activities and excursions.

#### SOUTHBOUND VOYAGE ITINERARY AND AVAILABLE EXCURSIONS

#### DAY 7 Kirkenes, the voyage south begins

Ports visited today: Kirkenes, Vardø, Båtsfjord, Berlevåg.

As we turn south, the northbound ports previously visited at night can now be seen by day. In the afternoon the ship docks in Vardø, Norway's easternmost port. Weather permitting, we may invite you to experience ice bathing in the Arctic Ocean! Local divers will display and lecture about the life in the ocean out on deck.

#### DAY 8 Hammerfest and Tromsø

Ports visited today: Mehamn, Kjøllefjord, Honningsvåg, Havøysund, Hammerfest, Øksfjord, Skjervøy, Tromsø.

Discover a hidden part of Finnmark on our

optional excursion to the North Cape for breakfast. Our next stop, Hammerfest, was founded in 1789, and in its time was Norway's polar capital, acting as a base for hunting expeditions to the high Arctic. In the majestic Lyngen Alps area we sometimes rendezvous with a local shrimp trawler. #### DAY 9 Vesterålen and Lofoten Islands

Ports visited today: Tromsø, Finnsnes, Harstad, Risøyhamn, Sortland, Stokmarknes, Svolvær, Stamsund.

The Vesterålen and Lofoten Islands are amongst today's highlights. In the morning we transit Risøyrenna, a channel that was specially made for Hurtigruten. You continue through the narrow Raftsund, the picturesque channel between the Vesterålen and Lofoten Islands, where you'll take a detour into the spectacular Trollfjord where steep cliffs hug the ship's sides (time and weather permitting). #### DAY 10 Arctic Circle, Seven sisters

Ports visited today: Bodø, Ørnes, Nesna, Sandnessjøen, Brønnøysund, Rørvik.

The Helgeland coast with its hundreds of islets, fertile farmland and steep granite walls is rich in local lore. Legends include that of the Seven Sisters - a row of mountain peaks, and of how an arrow fired by the troll Hestmannen formed the hole in Torghatten mountain.

#### DAY 11 Trondheim and Kristiansund

Ports visited today: Trondheim, Kristiansund, Molde, Ålesund. 
#### DAY 12 Bergen, disembarkation

Ports visited today: Ålesund, Torvik, Måløy, Florø, Bergen.

This morning, you still have a few nautical miles of fascinating scenery ahead. We sail through the Bergen archipelago before arriving in Bergen itself, which has given its visitors a warm welcome for more than 900 years.

# The Classic Voyage South (Kirkenes - Bergen, 6 days)

The spring highlights include the daylight sailing through the beautiful Vesterålen and Lofoten Islands, the Seven Sisters mountain range and the legendary 'mountain with the hole', Torghatten.

# The Classic Voyage North (Bergen - Kirkenes, 7 days)

This voyage sails the iconic Norwegian coastline's sheltered waters from Bergen towards the Russian border town of Kirkenes. En route you will stop at 34 ports and experience the wonders of the polar north and experience the Arctic Awakening.

# The Classic Norwegian Discovery (Bergen Kirkenes - Trondheim, 11 days)

This spring journey combines many highlights of the Classic Round Voyage. Starting in Bergen, you will cross the Arctic Circle twice, pass the North Cape, visit the turningpoint at Kirkenes and disembark in the medieval city of Trondheim.

#### A Classic Round Voyage (Bergen - Kirkenes - Bergen, 12 days)

This spring journey is the ultimate voyage with Hurtigruten. You will get the opportunity to see and experience the fantastic spring nature that Norway has to offer. You will visit 34 ports and cover over 2,500 nautical miles.

During spring the temperature can differ by more than 30°C from Bergen in the south to Kirkenes in the north.

#### SPRING HIGHLIGHTS





The darkness comes gradually and the sun sets earlier and earlier. And if you are lucky the Northern Lights will appear and provide an act of magic.

The days shorten and temperatures drop a notch, but that is no reason to stay inside. Outside, in the fresh air, there are plenty of activities to embark upon. Enjoy Hurtigruten's slow pace along the coast, and join us when we explore the cities and the colourful nature along the coast. Each port and the different parts of the coast give you the opportunity to experience something different.






#### DAY 6 Honningsvåg and the North Cape

Ports visited today: Øksfjord, Hammerfest, Havøysund, Honningsvåg, Kjøllefjord, Mehamn, Berlevåg.

Breathe in the crisp, clean air while watching a landscape that is austere in its beauty. After an early stop in Hammerfest, we arrive in Honningsvåg. This is the gateway to the spectacular North Cape which rises 300m from the ocean, and at 71° 10′ 21″N puts you a mere 2,000 kilometres from the Geographical North Pole. #### DAY 7 Kirkenes, the voyage south begins

Ports visited today: Kirkenes, Vardø, Båtsfjord, Berlevåg.

This is when your ship starts its southbound voyage, revealing ports during the daytime that we passed at night on our journey north. After crossing Varangerfjord we arrive in Vardø, the easternmost point of the country. In the evening, we call at Båtsfjord and Berlevåg.

#### DAY 8 Hammerfest and Tromsø

# **2E** RIB EXPEDITION TO RUNDE BIRD ISLAND

This RIB excursion introduces you to the beautiful Runde Island with its varied wildlife. You will experience a bird cliff that is home to more than 500,000 seabirds. Amongst them are Atlantic puffins, blacklegged kittiwakes and guillemots. This is the largest sea bird colony in Scandinavia. We will also visit the seal colony on Grasøyane, before heading back to Ålesund. On the way back you will see the beautiful Sunnmøre Alps.

This is followed by a drive up Ørneveien (Eagle Road) and a stop at Ørnesvingen (Eagle Bend), where a breathtaking panorama of the fjord, the magnificent mountains and Syv Søstre (Seven Sisters) waterfall gives you an incredible photo opportunity. The tour continues to Ålesund, a distinctive town known for its unique Art Nouveau architecture. An afternoon here is



best enjoyed from the town's highest point, Mount Aksla. Your excursion will conclude with a short sightseeing trip around Ålesund before heading back to the Hurtigruten pier.

From there you take a picturesque ferry ride from Eidsdal to Linge. Back on dry land, we head for the stark, wild, high-alpine areas, stopping en route for photos at the impressive Gudbrandsjuvet (Gudbrands Gorge). One of the many highlights of this trip is the series of 11 hairpin bends down the winding Trollstigen Pass. Once you've reached the bottom, it's time for a hot drink and a bite to eat before you continue on to the gentler landscape of the Romsdalsfjord. You conclude with dinner in Molde before embarking the Hurtigruten ship again.

#### **2C ART NOUVEAU WALK**

Distinguished by its numerous spires, towers and highly detailed ornamentation, Ålesund is

It owes this to the devastating fire which burned a large proportion of the city to the ground in 1904, following which the town was rebuilt in the fashionable style of the time, Art Nouveau. Your guide will take you on an informative walk through the streets of this enchanting town. Along the way you will pass the picturesque fishing port of Brosundet, the special Apotekertorget square and the beautifully decorated main street. You will also visit Jugendstilsenteret, which is the national centre for Art Nouveau. The museum offers everything from modern multimedia presentations to original interiors and provides a fascinating insight into the history of Art Nouveau.

#### 2D ATLANTERHAVSPARKEN AQUARIUM AND MOUNT AKSLA

Few large cities have managed to preserve their intimacy as effectively as Norway's third largest city, Trondheim. An ancient city, it was founded by the Viking King Olav Tryggvason circa 997. Your tour starts from the pier and takes you to Norway's national shrine, Nidarosdomen (Nidaros Cathedral) - Norway's only Gothic style cathedral, built over the burial place of St. Olav, Norway's patron saint. From Nidaros Cathedral, the bus then takes you directly to the Ringve Museum of Musical History, where your enthusiastic tour guide will bring the history of music to life.

#### **3B** TRONDHEIM WITH NIDAROS **CATHEDRAL**

Built over the burial place of St. Olav, the patron saint of Norway, this enormous building, with its countless details and decorations, dates back to around 1070.

You will be able to view the ruins of the medieval Castle Zion, built by King Sverre in the winter of 1182-1183, with its panoramic views across Trondheim's Fjord. You will then be shown a working farmyard before continuing to the Old Town which features buildings that used to stand in the very centre of Trondheim. Finally, you enter the visitors' centre and the 'Life Pictures' exhibition, showing you what life was like in the 1900s.

#### **3D** TRONDHEIM CITY WALK

We then pass Nidaros Cathedral, the national monument of Norway. You cross the old city bridge with its red gateway, known to the locals as "the portal of happiness", and enter the area of the city called Bakklandet, which has managed to preserve its charming wooden architecture. Originally this was the industrial part of the city, but now the old factories have been renovated into desirable housing surrounded by boutique shops and gourmet restaurants. And it's here that you find the world's one and only bicycle lift which has to be seen to be believed!

Norway's Varanger region is one of the most attractive and popular bird-watching areas in the Arctic due to it being directly in the path of migrating birds. Indeed, this is the only place in Europe you are likely to spot the rare Steller's Eider. Learn about this and other species throughout the day. Just off the coast of Vardø is the island of Hornøya, a breeding ground for some 70-80,000 arctic seabirds. This area is also a melting pot of Sámi, Finnish and Norwegian cultures, all of which you will learn more about during the trip.



#### **7A** THE RUSSIAN BORDER

You make your first stop at Storskog, the border station between Norway and Russia. Unfortunately you cannot cross the border itself, but are permitted to take pictures. From here travel to the small mining community of Bjørnevatn, before heading towards Pasvikdalen. This area is known to have Norway's largest population of brown bears. Back in Kirkenes, make a stop at the impressive Prestfiellet Mountain, which over-looks both the town and your Hurtigruten ship.



Then it's time to meet the dogs! The huskies are harnessed to your sledge, eagerly waiting to transport you across the frozen landscape. There will be two passengers per sledge, with each sledge travelling with its own "musher" (guide). You can have a go at driving the sledge yourself, or if you'd prefer, you can simply sit back and enjoy the ride. The track is just over 5km long, and is set in the most picturesque of landscapes. Afterwards, you have the option to visit the Snow Hotel (from approx. mid December, weather permitting) or the reindeer enclosure.

On your return you make a short stop to visit a Sámi family. From Honningsvåg, you drive through an underwater tunnel that connects the town with the mainland. The bus will then travel south along the majestic Porsangerfjord before heading back towards the coast to Hammerfest, the world's northernmost town, where you'll re-join your ship.

sightseeing trip through Harstad before moving on to the Trondenes peninsula. Here, you visit Trondenes' white medieval church, one of Norway's premier cultural heritage sites from the late Middle Ages (short ecumenical worship services are often held for visitors here). In Trondenes Historical Centre, you will find an exciting exhibition of original objects from throughout the region's history. The bus then takes you across Hinnøya Island, where you can enjoy a view of beautiful fjords, steep mountains and large fertile agricultural areas. Moving on, you will cross the Gullesfjord by ferry, giving you a chance to enjoy a hot drink and some freshly baked cakes before continuing to Sortland where you rejoin your Hurtigruten ship.

From here you set your course for Svolvær and are left with the memorable experience of seeing the king of birds close up and in his natural habitat - two hours that will stay with you long after you return home.


All the Hurtigruten ships vary depending on their size and age from the MS Finnmarken, Trollfjord & Midnatsol built in 2002 and 2003, to the traditional vessel MS Lofoten (1964), still a favourite for many returning guests. Each ship has a different style and design, from the on board art to the ship's colours and interiors. Despite their aesthetic differences, they provide the same intimate travel experience, with their own informal Hurtigruten atmosphere.

On board our ships, large, comfortable lounges provide panoramic views as you glide silently and slowly through some of the world's most beautiful and untouched scenery. All the ships, except for the older, smaller vessels have a small library where you can immerse yourself in a good book, and a café serving snacks and drinks 24 hours a day. Some of the newer ships have Jacuzzis and a fitness room.



DID YOU KNOW?

The first Hurtigruten ship, DS Vesteraalen was a steamboat with only 40 bunk beds and small cabins. Guest comfort was first prioritised on DS Dronning Maud in 1925 (picture above).



All our 11 ships have a wide range of comfortable cabins. They vary in size and location, sometimes within the same grade. As a general rule, outside cabins on the higher decks have a picture window while the ones on the lower decks have portholes.

#### **SUITES**

Choose from our wide range of comfortable cabins. Suites are graded QJ, Q, M, MG, and MX and have a seating area with TV. They have a shower/wc and most have a double bed\* (this may be two single mattresses set in a double frame which cannot be separated). Our sales consultants will be pleased to give advice if you would prefer a bath.

STANDARD AND SUPERIOR CABINS
Cabin grades I, L, J, N, P and U all have private facilities and twin beds, one of which can be turned into a sofa. Grades A, D and some I, J and N have upper

and lower berths and D grades on MS Lofoten have a wash basin only.

#### SPECIAL CABINS

With the exception of MS Lofoten, all our ships have at least one specially equipped cabin for disabled passengers. Please contact our reservations department for further information. Prices for cabins which can accommodate three or four people are available on request and inter-connecting cabins are available on some of our ships.

## **MS MIDNATSOL**


The name Midnatsol (Midnight Sun) is something to live up to, and this ship, dedicated to the Norwegian summer, does just that. The interior is bright, its colourful décor is inspired by the warm sunny climate, a motif also reflected in the many pieces of Norwegian modern art on display. MS Midnatsol was put into service on 15 April 2003 and is the fourth Hurtigruten ship to bear this name. The ship has a strong environmental profile and a modern design, with Norwegian materials used extensively throughout its interiors. Together with her sister ship, MS Trollfjord, MS Midnatsol is among the newest in the fleet. What characterises both ships is the large, two-storey panorama lounge above the bow and the large glass expanses that allow natural light to enter as well as providing extraordinary views. There are also 23 beautifully appointed suites, some of which have a balcony.



















### **MS TROLLFJORD**




### **MS FINNMARKEN**





### **MS NORDKAPP**



































## **MS POLARLYS**







### **MS NORDLYS**

MS Nordlys is named after the spectacular natural phenomenon visible in these waters between October and March. Nordlys, meaning the Northern Lights (or Aurora Borealis), which appear in the sky of the Northern Hemisphere as green and sometimes red flaming "waves" and will leave you with memories that will last forever. MS Nordlys was built in 1994 and its art, décor and colours are all inspired by the Northern Lights phenomenon. With her light and delicate interior, Norwegian artists have created a unique and distinct environment on board. 





























## MS RICHARD WITH







### MS KONG HARALD










## **MS LOFOTEN**



#### CORRESPONDENCE

If you make your booking through a travel agent all communication between you and Hurtigruten must be via that agent. If you book your holiday direct with us all correspondence will be sent to the Lead Passenger. Please quote your booking reference number in all communications. When you or your agent contact us we will usually confirm your holiday at the earliest opportunity and advise current flight times, prices, including any applicable supplements or extras, etc. For high season dates, when demand is greater, or if you book within eight weeks of departure, we may have to request your cabin, flight or hotel space and it may take slightly longer to confirm your holiday. An invoice will be sent to confirm your arrangement. If you are travelling with friends but would each like to receive separate documents please advise us at the time of booking. Travel documents are generally sent approximately 7-14 days prior to departure.

#### SPECIAL REQUESTS

If you have any special requests (e.g. dietary or medical), please inform us at the time of booking. We will do our best to meet such requests but cannot guarantee to do so and in no circumstances will any such request be accepted by us so as to form part of our contractual agreement.

#### MOBILITY

We are happy to welcome passengers who are not fully mobile and all ships (except MS Lofoten) have at least one cabin equipped for travellers using a wheelchair. Our sales consultants will also try to book appropriate hotel rooms. Passengers who use a wheelchair must bring their own, standard size, foldable chair and travel with a companion who is able to assist them. In mainland Norwegian ports there is a ramp for embarkation/ disembarkation. Excursions have not been adapted specifically for passengers with walking difficulties. It is essential you advise us of special requirements at the time of booking to enable us to make the necessary arrangements to ensure a trouble-free holiday.

## CHANGES TO THE ITINERARY AND EXCURSIONS

All routes and excursions are provisional and subject to change – weather, sea and ice conditions may affect the itinerary. Excursions may also be subject to minimum/maximum numbers. The operators reserve the right to change the content of excursions without prior notice. As Christmas approaches itineraries may change in order for ships to host dinners and celebrations for local communities.

#### MINIMUM NUMBERS

Some holidays are subject to a minimum number of participants to enable them to take place. Should the minimum not be reached we will advise you at least 60 days prior to your departure, when we reserve the right to cancel the holiday and refund all monies paid to us. Alternatively, you may choose another holiday with us but if the alternative arrangement is at an additional cost, the difference will be payable by you.

#### **BEFORE YOU GO**

#### PASSPORT AND VISAS

All guests have to present a valid passport or government approved ID card when they check-in.

#### **VACCINATIONS**

At the time of printing there are no compulsory vaccinations or health requirements for travelling to Norway. It is however the responsibility of all passengers to ensure they comply with any health requirements at the time of travel. We suggest you contact your doctor or relevant health authorities about any precautions you should take with regard to Deep Vein Thrombosis (DVT).

# **FLIGHTS**

#### FLIGHTS TO SUIT YOU

Designed to give you total flexibility plus the benefits of reduced airfares, the prices for all our Norwegian voyages exclude international flights and land arrangements. We have designed a range of arrival and departure packages that allow you to travel from your regional airport (where connections exist) and included our most popular destinations. If you prefer to arrange your own international flights you still have the option of adding extensions and/or extra nights. Please ask for details.

#### FARES AND FLIGHT INFORMATION

The airfares offered in the brochure are special package tour fares and cannot be altered or cancelled without charge. They can only be used in conjunction with our voyages. Refunds are not permitted on any unused portion of the air ticket and if you decide to return on a flight other than originally booked, the full one way fare will be charged by the airline.

All flight package prices are based on specific booking classes, if the relevant booking class is not available a supplement may apply, the reservations team will advise you if that is the case.

If you make changes to your flight arrangements most airlines will charge a fee when the ticket has been issued (usually about 45 days before departure). Where applicable, this fee will be invoiced to you.

Booking a complete package with Hurtigruten gives you the advantage of having everything smoothly organised for you from start to finish at the same time as your voyage. You will also benefit from protection under our ATOL licence (please see section 2 on page 100 or visit www.atol.org.uk for more details).

Please note that if you book more than 11 months in advance we will not be able to confirm your flight details and routing at the time of booking. As soon as the flights become available to book we will confirm the details.

#### **AIRLINES AND AIRCRAFT**

Our airline partners include Scandinavian Airlines, Norwegian, British Midland, Flybe and KLM Royal Dutch Airlines. The aircraft used on the different routes will be Boeing 737 & 757, Airbus 300 series, MD 80 & 81, De Havilland Dash 8, Q400 and Fokker 50 or similar.

#### IN FLIGHT MEAL SERVICE & FLIGHT UPGRADES

There is no complimentary meal served in economy class on domestic and international routes within Europe for airlines listed in this brochure (including our charters) snacks and refreshments

can be purchased on board. At the time of going to print snacks and drinks are still served on scheduled KLM and BMI flights.

#### **BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE**

The baggage allowance for most airlines is 23kg (50lbs) per person. Regulations can change, please check with the airline.

If you are travelling on one of our charter flights you will be advised about the applicable baggage allowance.

In addition each person is permitted to take one piece of hand luggage, subject to weight limits depending on the airline.

Please advise us at the time of booking if you wish to carry bulky items such as wheelchairs to enable us to clear this with the airline. Carriage of those and similar items cannot be guaranteed and maybe subject to a charge. If you exceed the baggage allowance, carriage of excess luggage may be refused or an excess charge may be made by the airline.

Any single piece of luggage weighing more than 32kg will not be accepted for carriage.



#### **GENERAL**

#### **BROCHURE ACCURACY**

The information and descriptions contained in this brochure have been checked by our staff and/or local agents to ensure they are correct. However, changes may occur after the date of publication and there may be occasions when Hurtigruten or local suppliers may withdraw some facilities. Should we become aware of any significant change which may be considered to have an effect on the enjoyment of your holiday we will do our utmost to advise you. Public holidays and religious festivals may also affect the availability of resort and hotel facilities. Tourist offices can provide details of such events. Some areas we visit are very remote, affected by prolonged cold weather or

difficult terrain. Provision of facilities will be subject to local conditions, and customs and lifestyles may differ from those to which you are accustomed.

#### HOTEL ACCOMMODATION

The standard of the hotels we use is equivalent to 3 or 4-star although there is no official hotel rating system in Norway. All rooms have private facilities (except for the Snow Hotel in Kirkenes). Single rooms may be smaller and less conveniently situated and may be double rooms for sole occupancy or purpose built single rooms. Hotels may charge for some facilities e.g. saunas.

#### **TOUR ARRANGEMENTS**

The voyages and tours in this brochure are based on independent travel, however all


ships and many of our featured hotels have information staff who will advise you on excursions and offer general assistance. Some of our holidays are part escorted.

#### **TRANSFERS**

Transfers are included as shown and are usually unaccompanied. They may be operated by private coach, scheduled airport coach or train, minibus or taxi. Full details will be forwarded with your travel documents.

#### WILDLIFE

The brochure includes pictures and descriptions of wildlife which may be seen from the ships and during excursions, but there is no guarantee of sightings.



#### **CABINS**

The times for checking out of cabins are according to the ship's timetable and may vary from day to day. On arrival in Bergen, Kirkenes and Trondheim (southbound) special rules apply:

- Cabins for departure from Bergen are available from 18:00 hrs.
- Check-out on arrival at Kirkenes is before 8:30 hrs.
- Check-out on arrival at Trondheim (southbound) is before 8:00hrs.
- Check-out on arrival at Bergen is before 10:00 hrs.

Please contact the reception for more information. If you are travelling in a suite different check-out timings may apply, please contact the reception. The facilities of the cabins vary between the ships and the various cabin grades. Towels and shower gel/liquid soap are provided in all cabins, in addition to this all cabins (except for MS Lofoten and some cabins on board MS Vesterålen) also have a hair dryer. Tea/coffee making facilities are available in suites only. There are no safety deposit boxes in the cabins (exceptions: some suites on board MS Trollfjord and MS Midnatsol and all cabins on board MS Finnmarken have a safety deposit box) and Hurtigruten cannot accept liability for any loss. Valuables may be handed in at reception to be kept in the ship's safe. For unspecified cabins, cabin numbers are allocated when you check in. The Hurtigruten operates a line service to a set timetable Bergen/Kirkenes/ Bergen, the shorter voyages being port to port sectors of the round trip. On rare

occasions it may be necessary to change cabin after completing one sector (e.g. Tromsø/Kirkenes and Kirkenes – Tromsø).

#### **CABIN NUMBERS**

For our Bergen-Bergen and Bergen-Kirkenes-Trondheim voyages and all suite bookings you will be able to choose a cabin number at no extra charge (subject to availability), for all other voyages 5 nights or longer you have the option to choose a cabin number at a fee subject to availability. Please see the applicable price panel for details of such fees. For all other voyages and if you decide not to pay the separate fee, your cabin number will be assigned upon embarkation.

#### CAFETERIA

Hot and cold drinks and snacks may be bought in the cafeteria, usually open 24 hours a day. During the winter, times are advised on board.

#### CURRENCY

Norwegian currency is used on board. Most major currencies may be exchanged. Visa, American Express, MasterCard and Diners Card are all accepted. A cruise card is used for payment for extras and settled at the end of your voyage.

This may be subject to change.

#### **DIETARY REQUESTS**

Special diets, e.g. vegetarian may be catered for if requested in good time. Passengers on strict diets, e.g. vegans, may find that there is a limited choice.

#### **ELECTRIC CURRENT**

220v AC. – pin Continental-type for which an adapter is required. If you need an adapter/converter, please bring your own with you.

#### EMBARKATION/DISEMBARKATION

In Bergen the Hurtigruten ships sail from the Hurtigruten Terminal, Nøstegaten 30, N-5010 Bergen. Taxi drivers will understand if you ask to be taken to the Hurtigruten Terminal and it is sign-posted as such locally. Luggage lockers are available in the terminal at a charge of NOK 30 (3 x 10 kroner coins are required.) The terminal is staffed and open for luggage check-in from 13:00 hrs. Passenger check-in begins at 15:00 hrs and embarkation takes place from 16:00 hrs. Cabins are available from 18:00 hrs.

There are no restaurant facilities in the terminal and passengers are free to explore Bergen until embarkation time. A buffet dinner is served in the evening of departure from Bergen, usually between 18:00-21:00 with open seating this evening only. Guests on our Classic voyages will find their table assignment for the rest of the voyage in the envelope they receive at check-in. When disembarking in Bergen, luggage will be delivered to the baggage



belt in the terminal. On the last day of the round voyage you will be asked to vacate your cabin a few hours before arrival. Information regarding luggage handling and disembarkation at other ports is available on board.

#### **ENTERTAINMENT**

The emphasis on board is on relaxation and getting away from the commercial entertainment which is so often a part of conventional cruises. Our aim is to get closer to unique environments and share the experience with fellow passengers. Musical entertainment on some stretches of the voyage may be offered in the bar area but there is no organised programme.

#### **GRATUITY POLICY**

It is not common practice to tip on Hurtigruten ships on the coastal voyage, but if you feel that individual crew members should be rewarded for providing exceptional service this is entirely at your discretion.

#### **INFORMATION**

There will be an information and safety meeting on board on the evening of departure from Bergen and Kirkenes. You will also receive an information pack. Each ship has a Tour Leader on board who sells and gives advice regarding excursions, issues a daily programme and news bulletin and makes announcements regarding places of interest, disembarkation, etc. Occasionally this service may be carried out by the reception. All Tour Leaders speak Norwegian, English and German.

#### INTERNET

There is an internet café on board all ships except MS Lofoten. Be aware that as the bandwidth is narrow, reception may be intermittent and internet and WiFi cannot be guaranteed. Charges may apply.

#### LAUNDRY

Laundry rooms with washing machines, dryers and irons are available on all ships. Tokens can be purchased at reception.

#### **MEALS**

The usual meal times are: breakfast from 07:30 to 10:00 hours (open sitting); lunch from 12:00/13:00 hours (open sitting); dinner from 18:30/19:00 hours (assigned seating). During high season, there may be two sittings, the times of which will be shown on board. Full board begins with a buffet dinner on departure from Bergen and ends with brunch on the arrival day back in Bergen. The food is Norwegian and breakfast is buffet style with a selection of cold meats, cheese, eggs, cereals and fruit. Lunch is the famous cold table with a choice of fish dishes, cold meats, salads, a selection of hot dishes, desserts and fruit. Dinner is a three-course set meal, please note there is not usually a choice of menu. Occasionally a cold table may be served in the evening and the set meal at lunch time. All vessels are fully licensed; the prices on board are the same as in mainland Norway.

#### **PORTERAGE**

Luggage handling is not included in the cost of your holiday. Apart from Bergen

you will need to carry your own luggage on and off the ship.

#### SHOPS

There is a shop on board all ships. They sell souvenirs, knitwear, books, postcards, postage stamps and a limited supply of toiletries. On MS Lofoten this service is handled by the coffee shop.

#### SHORE EXCURSIONS

Pre-booking excursions, where possible, is recommended as only remaining places will be sold on board. Excursions booked on board will be payable in Norwegian Kroner and the price may vary as a result of exchange rate fluctuations. Prebooking of shore-excursions is possible until 4 weeks prior to departure. If you choose to pay by credit-card, prebookings can be made until 2 weeks prior to departure. Excursions and their contents are subject to maximum/ minimum numbers, sailing times and weather/local conditions.

Excursions that are cancelled will usually be refunded in Norwegian Kroner on board.

#### **SMOKING**

Smoking is only permitted in designated areas on the outside decks. It is not permitted when the ships are in port. Smoking in the cabin is prohibited and subject to a fine.

#### **STABILISERS**

With the exception of MS Lofoten our vessels are equipped with stabilisers.



On the Norwegian coast the ships enter the open sea, for a few hours, on only a few occasions during the whole voyage. The majority of the time the ships sail between mainland Norway and the coastal islands where the sea is generally calmer.

#### **SUITE SERVICE**

We are pleased to introduce a range of extras if you book a suite on board one of our ships. They include a welcome present, tea/coffee making facilities in your cabin, an invitation to visit the bridge, complimentary free tea/coffee on board throughout your voyage and late check out. For a fee you also have the option to have breakfast served in your cabin and the use of a minibar. If there is capacity available you may book and pay for an upgrade to a suite when on board.

#### TEA/COFFEE

Except for the suites (Classic voyages only) cabins do not have tea/coffee making facilities but tea/coffee are available free of charge in the restaurant/bar after lunch and dinner and available for purchase around the clock.

#### **TELEPHONE/MOBILE PHONES**

All ships have pay phones and phone cards can be purchased from reception. Private mobile telephones may be used on board although reception may vary. Check with your provider for costs when using your phone abroad.

#### **VALUABLES**

Cabins are not equipped with a safety deposit box. Valuables may be handed

in at the reception for safe-keeping in the ship's safe. Hurtigruten cannot accept liability for the loss of valuables.

#### WHAT TO WEAR

On board dress is informal. Although some passengers choose to change for dinner the dress code is casual rather than formal. The weather in Norway can vary during the course of each voyage or even during the day. To cater for these variations we recommend the layered dress approach that enables you to adapt to changes in temperature, wind and precipitation conditions easily. For all voyages we advise you to take breathable rain and windproof clothing. A warm hat, gloves, scarf and thermal clothing can be useful, together with thermal underwear, during the winter months. On land where it may be icy, sturdy shoes are important for shore excursions and a walking stick/trekking pole may be useful.

You should pack a pair of UV protective sunglasses, even during the winter as the reflections of snow and ice can be harmful to the unprotected eye. Many ships offer a Jacuzzi on board, so take your swimsuit.

#### **WORKING SHIPS**

Our ships function as working ships calling at ports around the clock. You may expect some noise and vibration in some cabins during docking and loading of goods. This varies depending on the location of your cabin and the type of ship. Also, noise affects people differently and what may be a problem for one person may not be a problem for others. Please note that cabins on decks with passenger access to outside areas may sometimes have an obstructed view due to other passengers walking past. Please ask our reservations team for advice on the best cabin location for you.

 Your contract is with Hurtigruten Ltd., a company wholly owned by Hurtigruten ASA, on the basis of these conditions and the information contained in the conditions and the information contained in the brochure, and shall be governed by English law and the jurisdiction of the English Courts. You may however choose the law and jurisdiction of Scotland or Northern Ireland if you wish to do so. When you book an air package holiday or sailing with us the contract between package holiday or sailing with us the contract between us will exist as soon as you or your travel agent asks us to confirm your booking. We then become responsible to provide you with the voyage arrangements or air package holiday you have booked and you become responsible to pay for them, in each case subject to these terms and conditions. You will also become responsible to pay for any additional arrangements made by us on your behalf including International Flights not included in any air package, optional excursions, travel insurance or other arrangements requested by you and booked.

We accept liability for any damage caused to you or any person in your party by the failure to perform, or the improper performance of, the voyage or air package holiday arrangements when your booking is confirmed (subject to any changes subsequently agreed between us) (but excluding any additional arrangements or extras whether or not purchased at the same time as defined in paragraph 4B) unless:

(a) the failures which occur in the performance of the contract are attributable to you or some other person your party;

(b) such failures in performance are attributable to a third party unconnected with the provision of the services contracted for and are unforeseeable and unavoidable or;

(i) unusual or unforeseeable circumstances beyond our control, the consequences of which could not have been avoided even if all due care had been exercised; or

(ii) an event which we, or the supplier of the services could not foresee or forestall even with all due care.

Our liability, shall in any event be limited to:

i) the maximum of twice the cost of your travel arrangements, or

ii) the minimum amount payable in accordance with and/ or in an identical manner to

(a) the contractual terms of the companies that provide the transportation and accommodation for your travel arrangements, which are expressly incorporated into the contract and also form the terms and conditions of separate contracts between you and the carrier

(b) any relevant international conventions, including the Warsaw Convention 1929, whether as amended by the Hague Protocol 1955 or the Montreal Protocol 1999, or otherwise, or the Montreal Convention 1999. Carriage of rs and their luggage by sea is go

At any port or place we may refuse to embark or may disembark any passenger who, in the opinion of the ship's authorized personnel, might be excluded from landing at further destinations by local authorities or who may be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, or whose presence may be detrimental to the wellbeing of passengers or crew. 
